	The purpose of CCN is to: enable people to take greater responsibility for their own
	health; stay well in their homes and their communities; and receive timely and
	appropriate complex care. Two primary structures, Workstreams (WS) and Service
	Level Alliances (SLA) and programmes, influence the transformation, and lead the
	redesign, prioritisation and implementation of health and social services in
	Canterbury.
	To contribute to the aspiration of equitable health outcomes for Pacific, the health
	needs of Pacific People must be prioritised across all CCN WS and SLAs in planning,
	implementation and evaluation processes. Pacific representation on WS and SLA groups is one way in which this can be achieved.

	SLAs and ex officio representatives from the CDHB, CCN and PHOs.
