

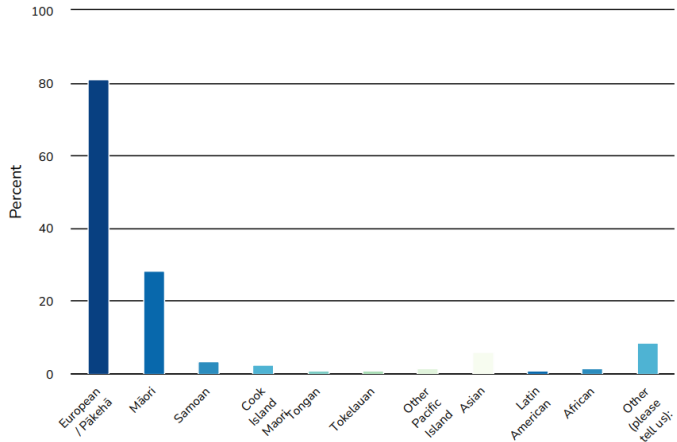

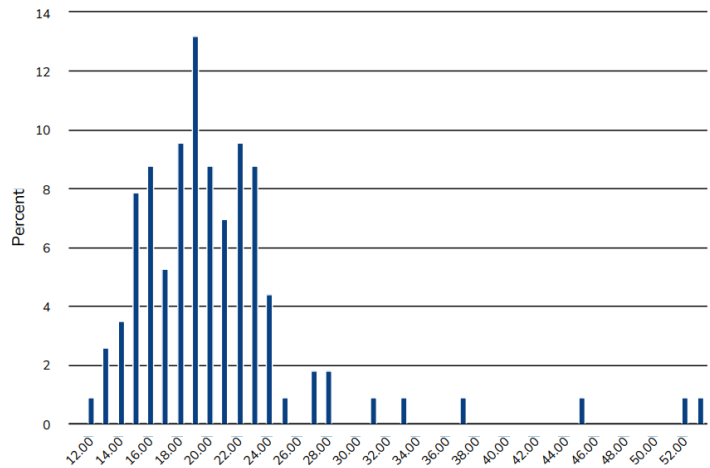

4. What ethnic group(s) do you belong to? You can choose as many as you need:



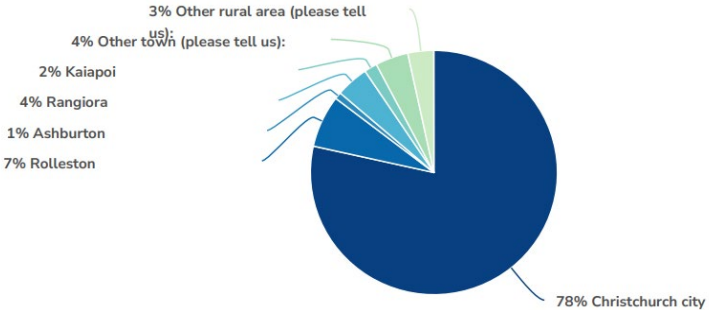

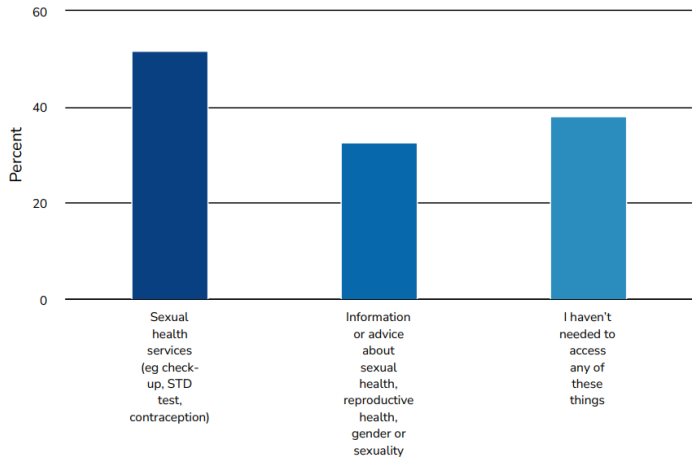

What part of Waitaha / Canterbury do you usually live in?

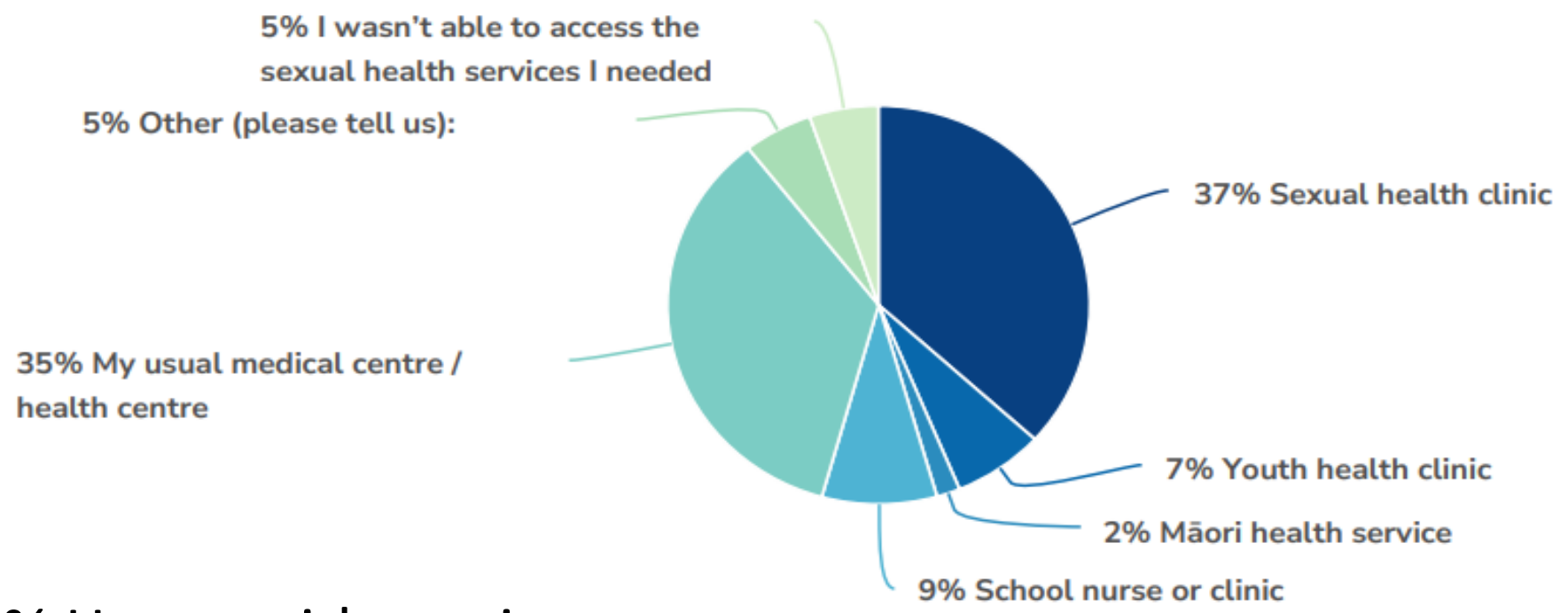


6. Have you ever needed to access any of the following? Select all that apply:



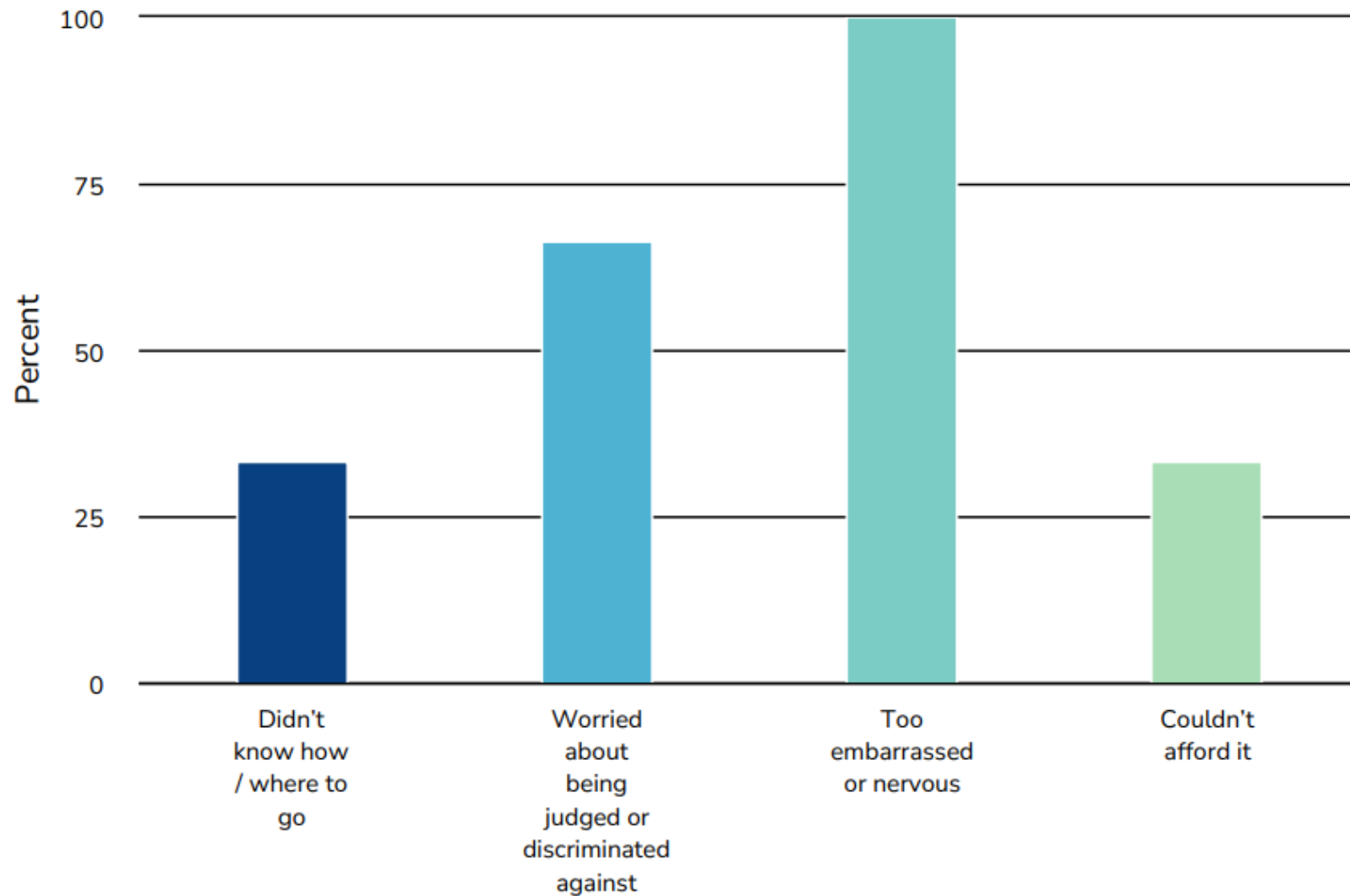
7. Where did you most recently access sexual health services?

Feedback Received

It made a huge difference that the clinician checked if I'd like to stop several times during the appointment so I felt some control and talked me through what was going to happen, how it was going to feel, why we were doing the procedure a certain way, bit by bit rather than all at once - this makes or breaks the whole communication thing. Took a year to get an appointment

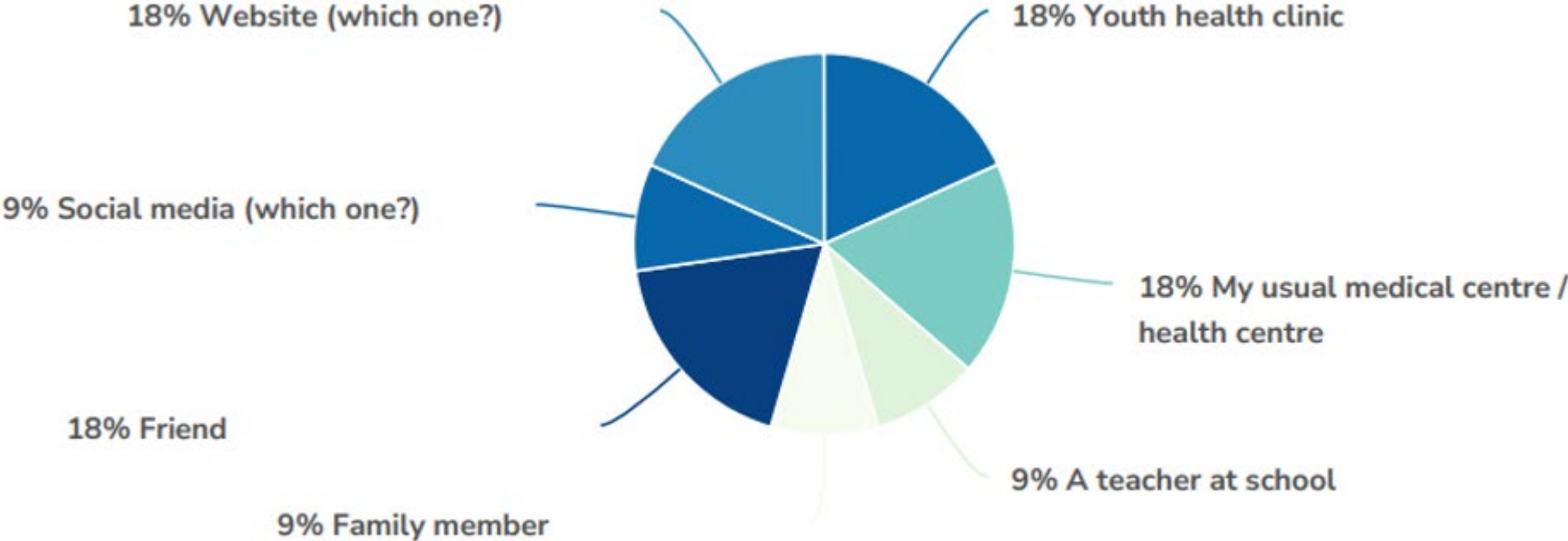
Overall I got what I needed from the experience. The hardest part is working up the courage and not feeling judged or awkward.

Made a comment on my weight when I asked her not to, she didn't tell me the number but congratulated me on losing weight when it has been an issue for me.

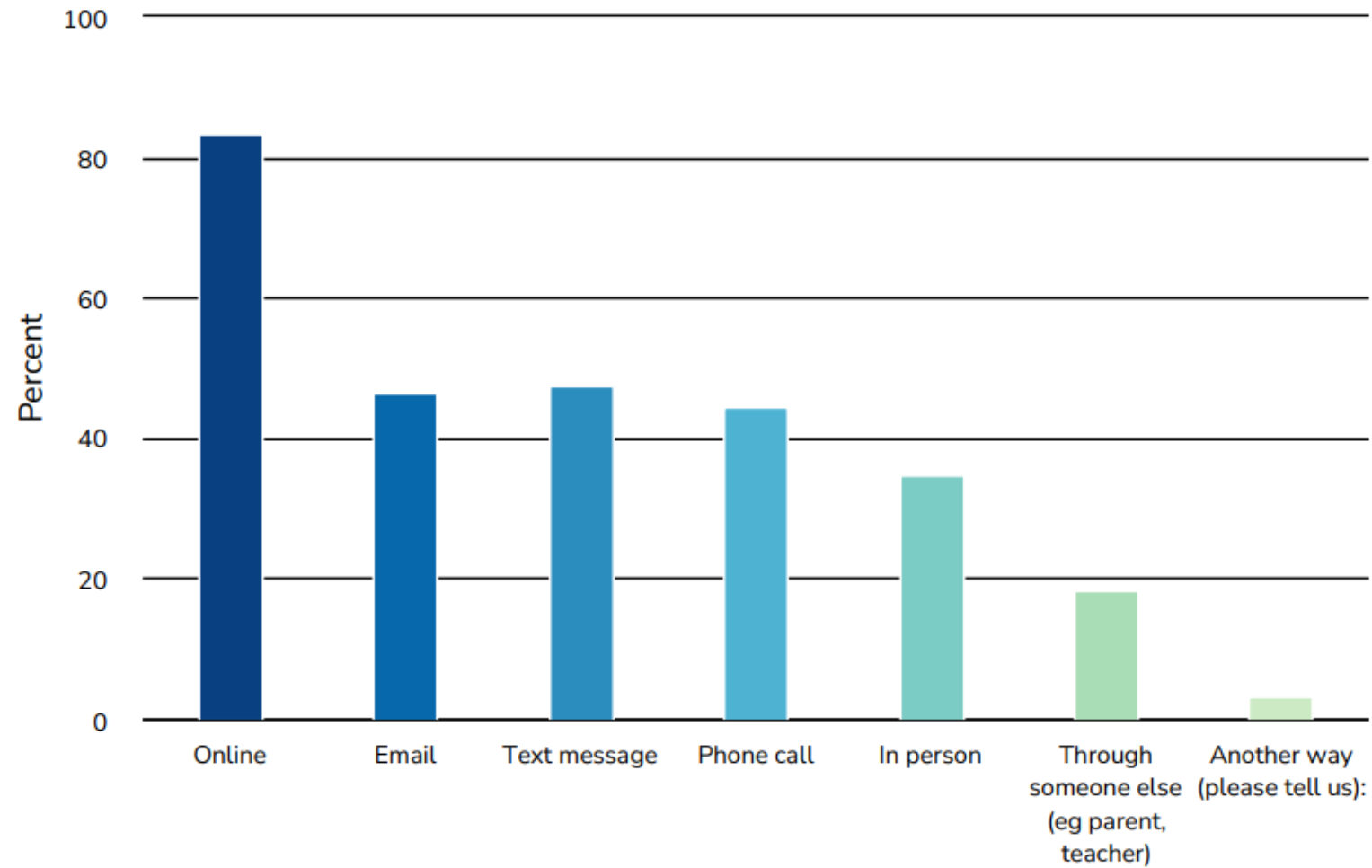
In general I'd feel more comfortable talking to a female doctor about my sexual health issues but my GP is a male

Still haven't had results 2 weeks later

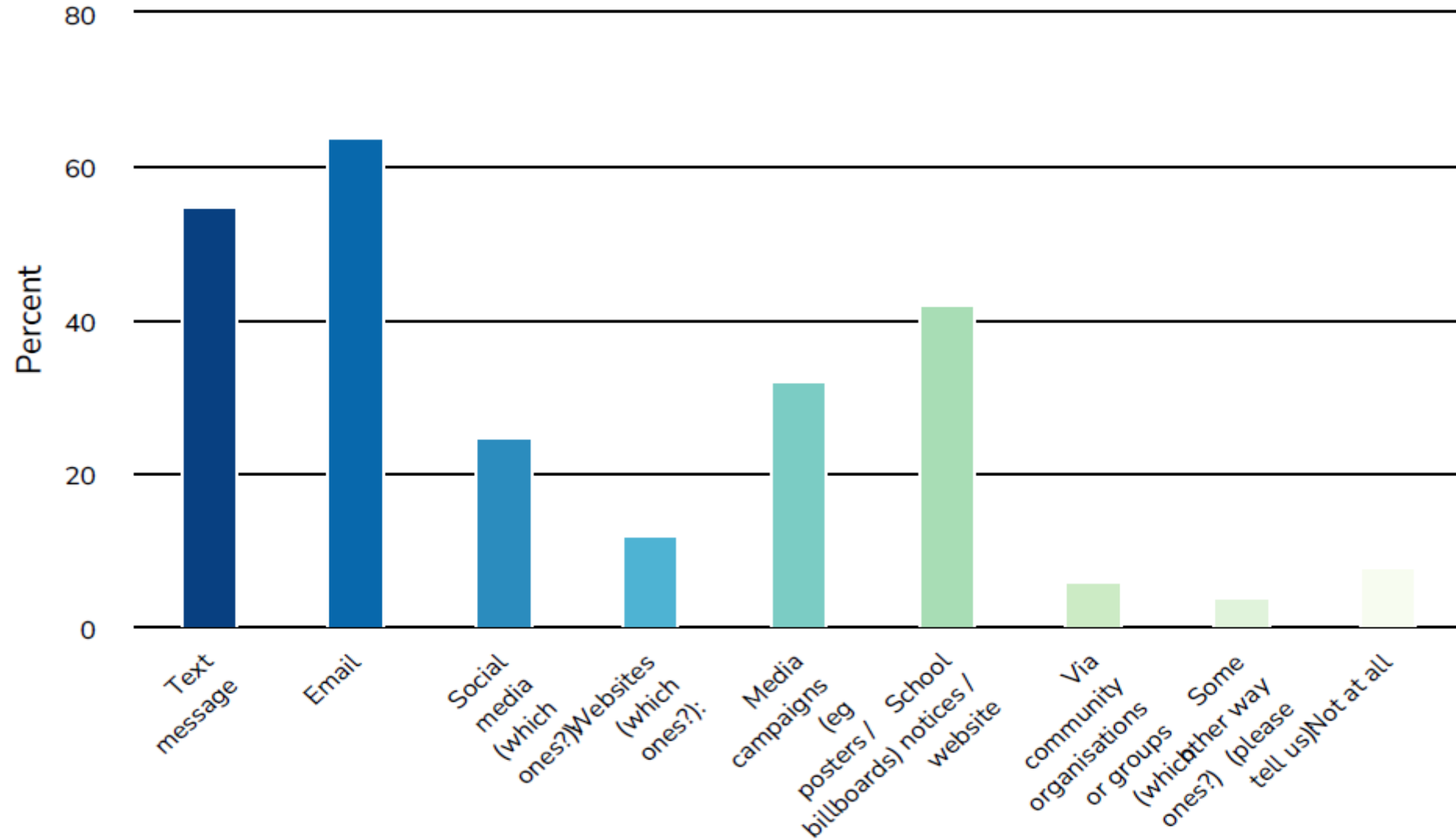
Where did you most recently get information or advice ?

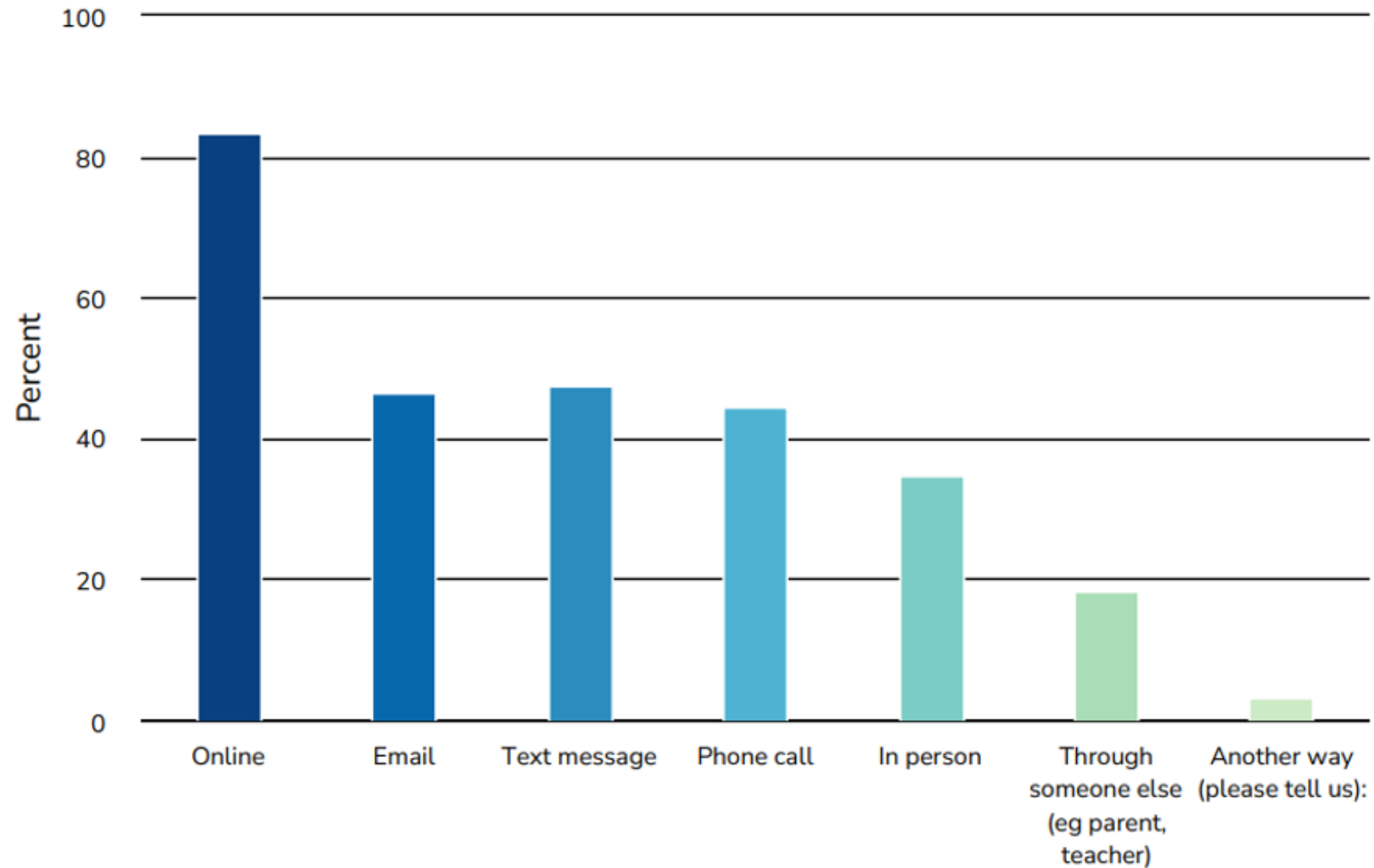

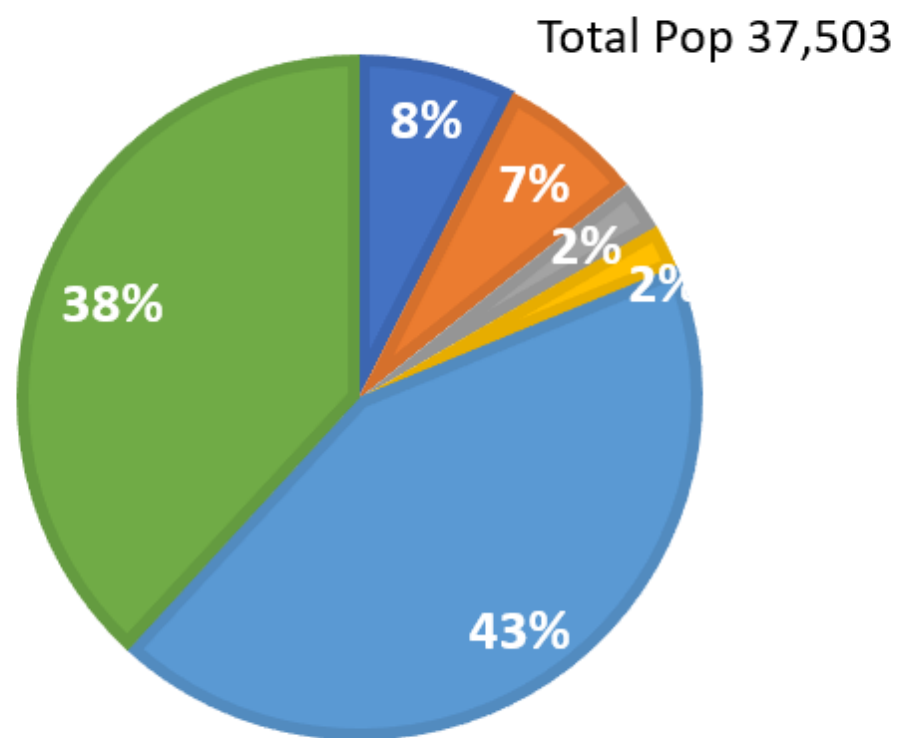

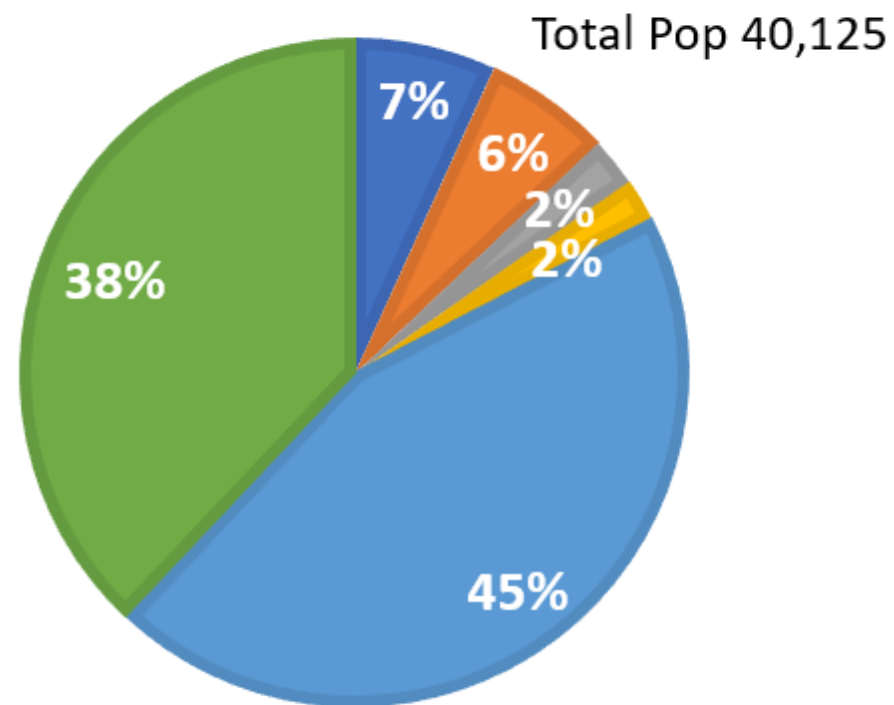
Population Split 15 -19 Years

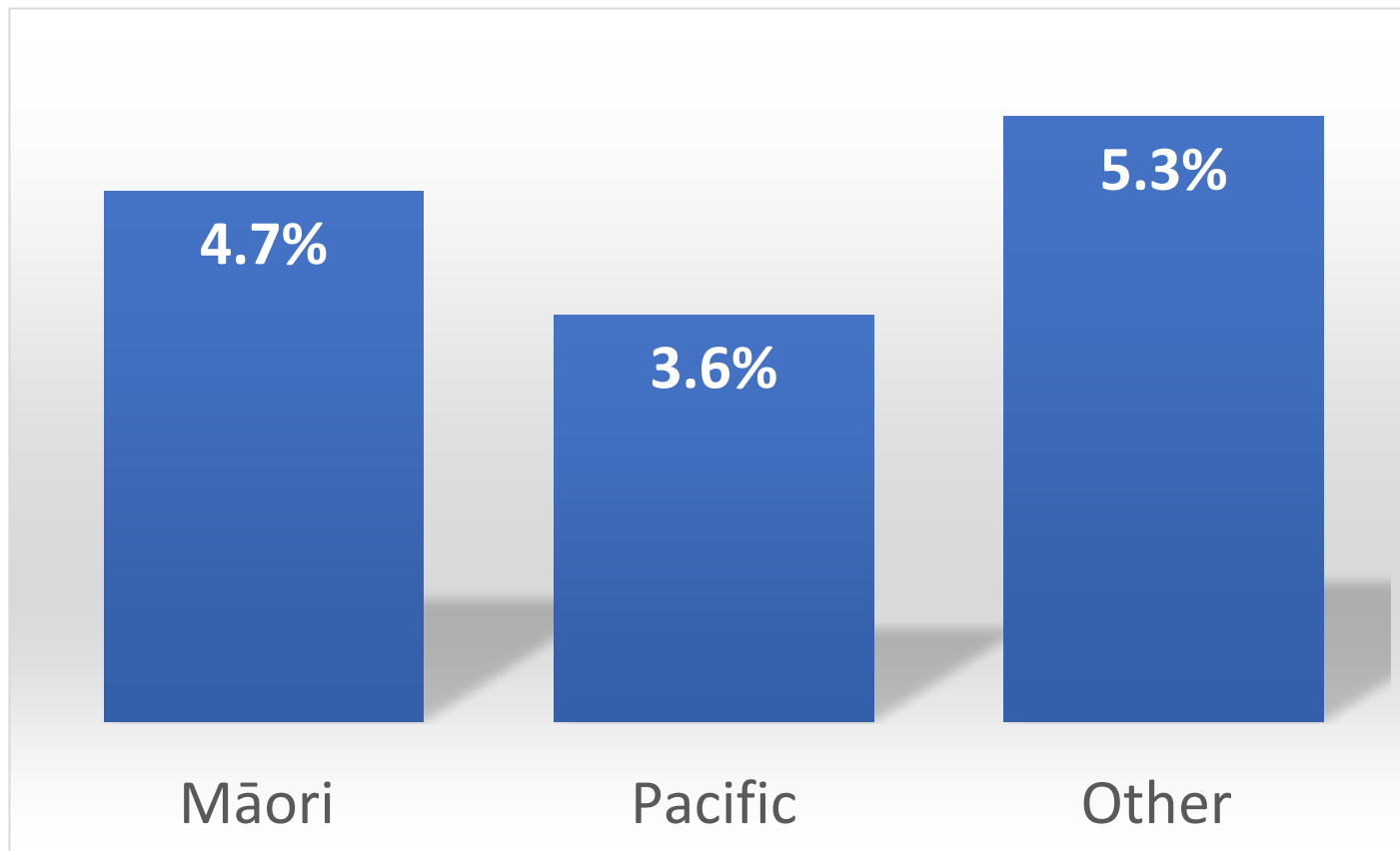

Percentage of eligible Population who Accessed Services by Ethnicity






